The Summer Reading One-Pager...

A One-Pager is a single-page response that shows your thinking about a piece of text you have read, whether fictional or informational, of any length. It is a way of displaying your insights, takeaways, and responses to the text. **The purpose of a One-Pager is to <u>own</u> what you have read.** We learn best when we are able to create our own patterns of understanding!

Getting started-		
		Decide if you'd like to work digitally or on paper.
		If you are working on paper, put your name on the back of an $8\ 1/2$ " x 11" sheet of paper or your choice of template from those provided. A digital project should follow similar size guidelines.
		Use lots of color, patterns, texture, writing/font styles, pictures, etc., to illustrate your thoughts and ideas clearly and creatively. Your ENTIRE PAGE should be filled when you are finished.
Using both images and words, include-		
		a representation of the themes or central idea of your reading. Remember-themes are always more than one word! (Instead of just "friendship," a theme might be that "one's chosen friends can be closer than the family they are born into by chance.")
		a section that represents key features of the protagonist (main character or the person your book is primarily about)
		a section that represents the ways that the setting impacts the protagonist and/or conflict
		a section that represents five key events (fiction) or steps (informational) presented by the text
		at least three quotes that are significant to theme/main idea, character development, or author's style- Be sure to cite with the author and page numbers.
		a section where you answer the questions-"Would you recommend this book to others? What type(s) of readers would you recommend it to?"
		a section that explains how this text resonates with you or how it connects to your own life.
Wrapping Up-		
		Make sure your page is completely covered with the required content and color, your name is on the back, and you have citations for all direct quotes.
		Turn in your paper One Pager to your English teacher or your digital One Pager to your 2023-2024 English Google Classroom on or before Monday, September 9th .
